






Army engineers were also busy rebuilding the bridges destroyed by the retreating LTTE cadres. Several makeshift bridges have been constructed to provide transport facilities to the liberated areas.

In most areas schools have reopened with the return of a large number of civilians from the centres for the Internally Displaced. Agricultural activities have also resumed in the liberated areas with the smooth flow of water from the sluice gates of Mavillaru which the security forces took control from the LTTE, a few months ago.
