Heiligendamm - GERMANY: G8 Heads of State (L-R) US President George W. Minneapolis, Minnesota UNITED STATES: Vehicles rest on a collapsed section of the I-35W bridge August 2, 2007 in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Divers combed the dark, debris-strewn waters of the Mississipi river Thursday searching for up to 30 people missing after a major bridge collapsed at rush hour, killing at least four people. Officials expected the death toll to rise, with dozens of cars and trucks dumped in the river after massive sections of the eight-lane bridge roadway were sheared off Wednesday evening. *AFP*
