Arantalawa massacre

May 3, 1986: A total of 21 passengers were killed and another 41 persons injured when the LTTE blasted a bomb inside Air Lanka (now Sri Lankan) Tri-Star aircraft at Katunayake International Airport. There were 128 passengers on board - among them 25 Britons, five of whom were injured. The Air Lanka Tristar had come from London's Gatwick airport, stopping at Zurich and Dubai to Male via Colombo.

May 2, 1987: LTTE terrorists shot dead 30 Buddhist monks and four civilians at Arantalawa, Ampara.

May 1, 1988: A landmine explosion carried out by the LTTE killed 26 people - 12 Sinhalese, nine Muslims and five Tamils at Sittaru.

May 5, 1991: Two 'Sea Tigers' attacked a Naval vessel in Trincomalee with an explosive-laden boat killing five SF personnel.

April 29, 1992: LTTE stormed in to a village in Alinchipothana in Polonnaruwa District and brutally killed 56 Muslims.

May 1, 1993: A suicide bomber deployed by the LTTE, later identified as Babu, killed President Ranasinghe Premadasa and 23 persons during a UNP May Day procession at the Armour Street Junction in Colombo.

> May 3, 2003: Tiger terrorists broke the Norway-led ceasefire, killing former EPDP chairman of the Karaveddy Pradeshiya Sabha.

May 4, 2007: Tamil Nadu Police disclosed that two Indian fishermen have been captured by the LTTE.

May 1, 2006: LTTE detonated a claymore mine strapped on to a bicycle, killing four civilians and a sailor, near Shanmugam Vidyalaya in Trincomalee. Three sailors and four civilians were also injured. In a separate incident on the same day, Tigers indiscriminately fired at unarmed innocent civilians in Thalgasweva, at the Bogas Junction in Pulmodai road Welioya, killing two and injuring three others.

April 30, 2008: Security Forces in Mannar captured the LTTE's 18-Base in Veppankulam and Kallikulam areas and brought the entire area under their control.

April 29, 2009: The LTTE made seven suicide attempts to recapture the earth bund in Rektavaikkal, using three human bombs, one explosive laden truck, three motorbikes and a double cab. Several people were injured.
