April 25, 2006: Army Commander Lt. General Sarath Fonseka was critically injured and at least eight persons were killed when a female suicide cadre of the LTTE, disguised as a pregnant woman, blew herself up in front of the military hospital inside the Colombo Army headquarters. 27 persons were injured in the explosion.

April 25, 2008: LTTE carried out a cowardly bomb attack targeting innocent civilians who were returning home after office hours at Pliyandala. A powerful bomb was exploded inside a CTB bus parked at Piliyandala public bus stand. 24 people including a monk were killed and 52 people, including schoolchildren were injured.





April 26, 2006: United States vowed to organise an international pressure campaign against the LTTE in the aftermath of Tuesday's suicide bombing which injured Army Commander. Assistant Secretary of State Richard Boucher said the State Department was in touch in Washington and abroad with other countries 'to bring to bear whatever pressure we can on the Tigers to abandon this course of action" and to look for ways to support the Government of Sri Lanka.
