the receiving end due to barbaric acts of Tiger terrorists, these countries turned a Nelsonian eve on those brutal killings. It was mostly the Tamils in the North and the East who became unfortunate victims as LTTE terrorists showed no mercy even to their own community.

■ The countries that now show concern about the rights of Tamils did not utter a word against those LTTE atrocities. When the Tiger terrorists mercilessly killed hundreds of thousands of innocent people. none of those champions of human rights were there even to speak a word. The LTTE rump. Tiger sympathisers or Tamil diaspora now make wild allegations to bring the Government into disrepute and woo sympathy of the international community.

Nov. 14, 1988: LTTE cadres shot dead 26 Sinhalese civilians and two security forces personnel at Paniketiyawa, Gomarakadawela in the Trincomalee district.

Nov. 14, 2008: LTTE terrorists shot dead TVMP President Kumarasawamy Nandagopan alias Ragu in Colombo.

Nov. 16, 1992: Commander of the Sri Lanka Navv. Vice Admiral W.W.E.C. Fernando and four Navv personnel are killed by a suicide bomber riding a motorcycle at Galle Face in Colombo.

> Nov. 16, 2006: LTTEers, posing as Indian fishermen, were caught smuggling weapons into uncleared areas in the North. Tiger terrorists had hijacked boats belonging to Indian fishermen in the Northern seas.
